About Northern Mallee LLEN

Northern Mallee Local Learning and Employment Network (NMLLEN) is one of 31 LLENs across Victoria which were established in 2001 as a result of the recommendations of the Kirby Report- Ministerial Review of Post Compulsory **Education and Training Pathways in Victoria. LLENs** were established as not-for-profit, community-based incorporated associations to identify gaps in education and training, provide advice on local and State-wide policy issues, and broker cross-sector partnerships. NMLLEN is a membership-based organisation that brokers partnerships to provide better pathways and support for young people in the Northern Mallee Region. NMLLEN's region covers the Mildura Rural City Council LGA (including the towns of Mildura, Merbein, Irymple, Red Cliffs, Ouyen, Werrimull, and Murrayville) and Robinvale (part of Swan Hill Rural City Council LGA). In 2023, NMLLEN received funding from the Victorian Department of Education for contracts related to School to Work, On Track Connect, and the Mallee Navigator program. NMLLEN also received funding from Agriculture Victoria for the Northern Mallee

Horticulture Immersion (NMHI) Project, aimed at supporting

students' transitions into horticulture careers.

CHAIR' S REPORT

During this last year all Local Learning and Employment Networks (LLENs) across Victoria responded to a change in direction in line with Victorian Government policy and the Firth Review. With new contractual arrangements in place the Board and staff of Northern Mallee LLEN worked extremely diligently to provide opportunities in training and employment for our young people, remaining a connection point for education and industry. The first of the three year School to Work contract is now complete and brought a range of learnings for all.

An important review of the LLEN network occurred during 2023. There are 31 LLENs across the state of Victoria and all LLENs exchange information and collaborate through the VicLLEN network. After some 20 years of operations, government was keen to explore the roles and services that LLENs provide in their communities and across the state. Facilitated by the VicLLEN network, this review emphasized that all LLENs are keen to stay focused on place based delivery, with years of experience and understanding of their local communities. There is always room for growth and improvement and the VicLLEN network is keen to collaborate further with government and establish an alliance that can advocate and respond to strategic opportunities in training and employment for young people.



NMLLEN enjoys celebrating student success and continues to support the Vocational Education and Training Delivered to Secondary Students (VETDSS) Awards, this year sponsoring the Runner up of the Year. Congratulations to Shae Martin who received this award and to all nominees and award winners. It is wonderful to witness the amazing accomplishments of our young people. I thank all those involved in organizing what is a great event each year.

During the year a difficult decision was made by the Board in regard to the Navigator program. NMLLEN has managed this program since its inception in 2016 which supports vulnerable young people through outreach and case management, enabling re-engagement into education, training or employment. It was determined not to submit an application for what would be a new five year contract. This was simply due to resourcing issues. I would like to acknowledge and thank all partners in this program including Mildura Rural City Council, Murray Mallee Local Learning and Employment Network and the Department of Education for all their work and support provided to the young people that received assistance through this program. The Board and staff of NMLLEN would like to congratulate Mallee Accommodation and Support Program (MASP) and their partners in the delivery of the new platform for Navigator. EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

School to Work Program

The Northern Mallee LLEN (NMLLEN) commenced a new school to work program funded by the Department Education in 2023, to support Senior Secondary School pathways reform. NMLLEN committed to offering industry immersion experiences for state, catholic and independent secondary schools. The Northern Mallee LLEN board and staff are committed to providing services which connect industry to education.

NMLLEN staff developed a range of immersion experiences that enabled students to engage with various industries. NMLLEN acknowledge the support received from both industry and secondary schools which allowed these activities to be highly successful.



Secondary school students undertook one hundred and forty-seven work based learning placements. Teachers and students participated in forty-seven School to Work events and thirty industry immersion activities exposed students to various industries. Industry immersion experiences included: workplace visits, mock interviews, guest speakers' incursions, work readiness and career development events.

Notable Highlights:

• Come and Try Days in the areas of Allied Health, Engineering, and Social Welfare. These events provided students with hands-on experiences from industry experts. The Come and Try Days increased students' knowledge of the skills shortage industries.

• STEM Idols partnership with Agriculture Victoria where Ag Vic representatives facilitated the **Get into AgSTEM** workshops in both Mildura and Robinvale. Seven STEM Idols shared their individual career pathways into STEM. Students increased their knowledge of the career pathways available in the Sunraysia region.

• Southern Cross Business Advisers (SCBA) Accounting Cadet Program presented students with information from SCBA Directors, Accountants, Administration Managers, Cadet Accountants and Latrobe University on the Cadetship program and La Trobe University Bachelor of Accounting entry requirements. The event provided students with an opportunity to gain knowledge of different pathways available to enter the accounting industry in Mildura.

VETDSS Transport increases access for students to attend vocational education training subjects.

Northern Mallee Horticulture Immersion (NMHI) Project

The **NMHI Project** collaborating with Chaffey Secondary College, industry, and local secondary schools. The project was funded by the Secondary School Agriculture Fund which is part of the Victorian Government's four-year \$50 million commitment to the Agricultural College Modernisation Program. Sixty one students from Chaffey Secondary College, Red Cliffs Secondary College, Merbein P10 College, Mildura Specialist School and Irymple Secondary College participated in the program.

Students in Years 9 to 12 attended Chaffey SC Farm each Friday for a term to complete technical and practical tasks on the farm. Industry immersions to local horticulture organisations allowed students to see firsthand the modern technology used in horticulture across the Mallee. I express my most sincere appreciation to all the stakeholders who made this immersive program the success it was. I am also pleased to share that the groundwork and foundations established will allow students to experience this learning opportunity again in 2024 and beyond.

Conclusion

The NMLLEN staff have once again delivered a high number of opportunities to develop students' knowledge of growth industries and allowed students to hear from experienced industry experts. My most sincere thank you to all our industry and secondary school partners for their willingness to work with the NMLLEN. I acknowledge the NMLLEN Committee of Management and staff for their unwavering commitment to young people and ensuring they have access to the high quality programs we deliver which will enable them to make informed decisions on future pathways, education and training. 2023 Work Based Learning Statistics


Northern Mallee LLEN demonstrated outstanding performance by not only meeting but surpassing its Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) in the areas of Work Based Learning (WBL) placements and School-to-Work events. This commendable achievement was not exclusive to the Northern Mallee region but was mirrored across both regional and state-wide LLENs. The collaborative efforts of these LLENs played a pivotal role in elevating placement opportunities for students. The surge in participation in School-to-Work events was driven by a robust demand for School-Industry engagement from educational institutions. The diverse range of placements offered by Northern Mallee LLEN includes Work Experience, Structured Workplace Learning (SWL), and School-Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SBATS). The spectrum of event types organised encompasses Guest Speaker and Industry Presentations, Career Events, Industry Immersion, Workplace Visits, Work Readiness sessions, and Mock Interviews.


Northern Mallee LLEN- Placements used and Events






The statewide and regional targets were also exceeded. Regional LLENs together achieved 1107 WBL placements against a target of 655. The 31 Victorian Statewide LLENs also exceeded their KPI of 4800 statewide WBL placements and 425 events. This success underscores the collective commitment of Northern Mallee LLEN and VicLLENs to foster meaningful connections between Secondary schools and Industry facilitating industry immersion experiences for Secondary Students.

2023 Work Based Learning Highlights


Work Experience enables students to observe and explore possible career options while undertaking a work placement in a real workplace. Work Experience and Structured Work Placements are available to students 15 years and over including VCE students, however, some exceptions apply. In 2023, Northern Mallee LLEN schools used 39 work experience placements through the School to Work Portal for secondary school students in the Northern Mallee Region.

Schools that had students arrange a Work Experience placement through the STW Portal included:

Chaffey Secondary College, Red Cliffs Secondary College, Merbein P10 College, Mildura Senior College, Irymple Secondary College, Robinvale College and St. Joseph's College Mildura.

STEM Idols

STEM Idols brought together 60 Year 9 girls and 10 science teachers from the Northern Mallee region including schools from as far as Ouyen and Murrayville for an immersive exploration of the intersection of agriculture and STEM.

Led by Anna-Leisa Vietz, Community Education Manager, and Dr. Gabriela Constanza Martinez Ortiz, Community Education Officer, both from Agriculture Victoria Research, the event featured a hands-on Digital Agriculture activity, teaching students to build digital moisture sensors and analyse data for efficient water use. Agromillora Australia generously donated 20 Olive plants for the workshop.

Get into AgSTEM Workshop at Robinvale College



On August 10th, Robinvale College hosted the "Get into AgSTEM" workshop, a remarkable event spearheaded by Anna-Leisa Vietz, Community Education Manager, and Dr. Gabriela Constanza Martinez Ortiz, Community Education Officer, from Agriculture Victoria. This workshop brought together 27 students from Robinvale College and Manangatang P-12 College for an immersive experience in Digital Agriculture STEM activities.

During the workshop, students had the unique opportunity to create digital soil moisture sensors, gaining practical insights into monitoring a plant's immediate environment. They also delved into the analysis of class datasets, learning how to make informed decisions to enhance water efficiency.



Anna and Gaby, with their STEM expertise in applications in agriculture, offered valuable insights into their career paths. Dale Northern Harvey, Mallee School LLEN to Work Coordinator, contributed by shedding light on AGSTEM career pathways and the Northern Mallee Horticulture Immersion Project.

VET delivered to school students (VDSS) Transport Program



In 2023, the Department of Education initiated a VET Transport pilot project aimed at facilitating access to transportation for VDSS students. The primary objective was to enhance secondary student attendance in VDSS subjects. Notable participating schools included Ouyen P - 12 College, Mildura Senior College, Red Cliffs Secondary College, Robinvale College, Werrimull P - 12, and Merbein P - 10.

During the pilot project in 2023, a total of 43 VDSS students were granted access to transportation, enabling them to participate in various vocational education training programs offered at Sunraysia Institute or TAFE and the Riverside Trade Training Centre.

Building on the success of the initiative, the Department has decided to extend and refund the Transport program into 2024. This continued support aims to break down transportation barriers for students, fostering increased attendance for 87 students in VDSS subjects. The ongoing commitment to providing accessible transport reflects the Department's dedication to creating opportunities for educational advancement and inclusivity.

Mildura Specialist School, Applied Learning Group Project and Industry Immersion Event



Each year, Mildura Specialist School in partnership with a selected retail business conduct an Applied Learning Group Project for Year 10 and 11, VET Retail students. In 2023, Mildura Specialist School approached Mildura Bunning's Warehouse to partner with the school. Sixteen students have been attending Mildura Bunnings Warehouse for the Applied Learning Component of the Certificate II in Retail Services. The project helps students work towards completing the certificate as a group.

Students complete a Bunnings Induction and store tour before commencing the Applied Learning Component. Mildura Specialist School teachers supervise the training of the students at each industry excursion to Bunnings then assess the students who are required to demonstrate stocking shelves, fronting shelves, price ticketing and interacting with staff and customers where possible.

Bunnings staff assisted by providing a designated training area, staff guidance on store procedures and store supervision to the group of students. Thanks to Bunnings Warehouse for assisting the Applied Learning Group Project in 2023.

VIC VICE VR Experience Roll Out

VIC VICE is a cutting-edge virtual reality platform that offers students in Victorian classrooms a chance to experience various workplaces in a fully immersive, interactive and multi-sensory way. Northern Mallee LLEN staff have introduced this new technology to schools in our region and enabling students and staff to experience virtual industry tours. There are currently 4 key sectors-Agriculture, Community Services, Transport and Logistics and Health under which 12 workplaces are covered.

SCBA presented its Business Services and Accounting Cadetship Program, featuring guest speakers Tony Jones (Director), Trudi Martin (Administration Manager), Mikayla Trobbiani (Accountant and former SCBA Cadet), and James Prictor (Cadet Accountant), alongside Mei Li Kok from La Trobe University. SCBA's diverse services, spanning compliance to human resources, were showcased.

Northern Mallee Horticulture Immersion (NMHI) Project



Northern Mallee LLEN led the 2023 Northern Mallee Horticulture Immersion Project in partnership with Chaffey Secondary College. The project is funded by the <u>Secondary</u> <u>School Agriculture Fund</u> which forms part of the Victorian Government's four-year \$50 million commitment to the <u>Agricultural College Modernisation Program.</u>

The goal of the Northern Mallee Horticulture Immersion (NMHI) Project is to encourage the uptake of Certificate II in Rural Operations, Certificate II in Horticulture (VDSS), or the VCE Agriculture and Horticulture studies in the following year or to commence a School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SBAT's) aligned to students secondary school subjects to following a career pathway by providing students with the opportunity to study and work while completing their secondary school certificate.

There were some great outcomes with the project with student study pathway-focused outcomes for future enrolments from the NMHI Project in 2023, they were as follows.

- Increased VDSS enrolments Years 10, 11 and 12
- Increased VCE Agriculture and Horticulture Studies enrolments, Years 11 and 12
- Increased Agriculture and Science related studies in Year 10

The NMHI Program 2024 will be led and coordinated by Chaffey Secondary College with partnering schools Merbein P10 College, Red Cliffs Secondary College, Irymple Secondary College, and Mildura Specialist Schools in collaboration with Northern Mallee LLEN and Industry.

Two Groups of sixteen participants (totalling 32 students) will commence the NMHI Program in 2024 over the two semesters.



Ontrack Connect

On Track Connect aims to assist young people who have left school in the previous year and who are not studying or in full time work at the time of the annual Department of Education (DE) 'On Track' survey of school leavers a large-scale survey run by the Social Research Centre, on behalf of the Department of Education. In 2023, 11 students were referred out of which 7 were females and 4 were Male. 7 out of the 11 referrals were Year 12 school leavers. 6 were contacted and 5 were uncontactable. 3 had found employment.

Status of Ontrack refferals from 2023




The young people that were contacted were looking for advice on education, training and employment.

Navigator Program

The Mallee Navigator Program, launched in September 2016 as a collaborative initiative involving Northern Mallee LLEN, Murray Mallee LLEN, Mildura Rural City Council, and Red Cliffs Secondary College, has played a crucial role in re-engaging young individuals aged 12 to 17 with less than 30% school attendance in the Mallee region.

This program, spanning Mildura Rural City Council, Swan Hill Rural City Council, Gannawarra Shire, and Buloke Shire, provides intensive wrap-around case management support to help reintegrate eligible young people into education or training. Since its inception, the Mallee Navigator program has received over 400 referrals. 
